

Resources for Recording a Presentation

There are two primary ways to record – one can include an audio only recording, or include audio/video. In general, professional consensus is that audio/video is best, however, we leave that decision entirely up to each presenter.

Below are some links that provide guidance in preparing a recorded presentation. There are also various software tools available online that will allow you to record from your computer outside of a meeting platform. Whichever option you choose, the end product should be saved as a video file and uploaded via the Presenter Information page on the NARWC website.

For presentations at the NARWC Consortium Meeting: SixDigitAgendaCode-LastName
